## Steve and Maggie Halloween: 5 Little Pumpkins

# Curriculum Connection:

## Mathematics:

This lesson focuses on counting, number recognition, and quantity discrimination. Students will practice counting from 1 to 10 using Halloween-themed objects and apply their counting skills to the "Halloween I Spy" activity.

## Visual Arts:

The "Halloween I Spy" activity provides an opportunity to use fine motor skills to carefully color the Halloween-themed items, fostering attention to detail.

## Language Arts:

While singing along with Steve and participating in the activity, students will engage in language development by listening to instructions, discussing their findings, and sharing their observations with classmates.

# Learning Goals:

## Mathematics:

### Students will:

- Count from 1 to 10 with accuracy using Halloween-themed objects.
- Recognize and identify numbers from 1 to 10 in the context of Halloween.
- Practice quantity discrimination by identifying groups of Halloween-themed items.

## Visual Arts:

### Students will:

- Develop fine motor skills by coloring within the lines.
- Foster creativity by selecting colors for the Halloween-themed items.

## Language Arts:

### Students will:

- Engage in active listening while singing along with Steve.
- Practice oral communication skills by discussing their observations and findings during the "Halloween I Spy" activity.

# Lesson:

## Counting Introduction:

Begin the lesson by introducing Halloween-themed pictures or objects (e.g., plastic spiders, toy bats, miniature pumpkins) to the students. Show each item to the class and discuss its Halloween connection. As you display each Halloween item, count from 1 to 10 with the class. For example, if you show a plastic spider, say, "Let's count how many spiders we have. One spider, two spiders," and so on. Encourage students to participate by showing the corresponding number of fingers as you count.

## Viewing the episode and Singing Along:

Viewing the episode and Singing Along: Play the Kidoodle.TV episode "Steve and Maggie Halloween: 5 Little Pumpkins" for the students. Encourage them to sing along with Steve and count using Halloween-themed objects as visual aids. As Steve counts, have students show numbers on their fingers to actively engage with the counting.

## Discussion:

After watching the episode, engage the students in a brief discussion.

Ask questions like:

- "What did Steve count in the video?"
- "Why was Steve scared? Where was Maggie?"
- "How many pumpkins did Steve count?"

## Halloween I Spy Activity:

Distribute the "Halloween I Spy" worksheets to each student. The worksheet includes Halloween-themed pictures. Explain to students that their task is to find and color the specified amount for each Halloween-themed picture on the worksheet. For example, 5 means that students should find five pumpkins and color them.

## Counting Exercise:

After completing the "Halloween I Spy" activity, have a brief counting exercise. Ask students to count and share how many of each item they found on their worksheets.

## Conclusion:

Summarize the lesson by revisiting the Kidoodle.TV episode and singing the

"5 Little Pumpkins" song with the students one more time. Encourage them to participate actively, showing numbers on their fingers as they count along. Ask the Kindergarteners to share something new they learned today about counting Halloween-themed items.

## Extension:

As an extension activity, students can collaborate to create a Halloween-themed counting book. Each student can contribute a page to the book, featuring a different Halloween item (ghost, vampire, pumpkin, witch) and a corresponding counting rhyme or story. For example, one page might say, "One friendly ghost saying 'Boo!'" and feature a drawing of a ghost. The students can work together to illustrate and write the text for each page, creating a unique class counting book.

## Assessment

Assess students' comprehension through their ability to accurately count and color the Halloween-themed items on their worksheets. Observe their engagement and understanding during the counting exercise and discussion.
